**Subject :- Grant of Extended Permission to Dr. G.D.Pol Foundations Yerala Medical Trust Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Institutional Area, Sector No.4, Kharghar, Navi Mumbai- 410210, Maharashtra (AYU0167) with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 54 seats in 12 PG courses** in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-04 seats,(ii) Kriya Sharir - 04 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir-04 seats, (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats, (v) Rasa Shastra & Bhasajya Kalpana - 08 seats (vi) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan - 04 seats, (vii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka - 04 seats, (viii) Shalakya - 04 seats (opted for Shalakya Tantra Netra Roga Chikitsa-02 seats and Shalakya Tantra KNM Roga Chikitsa-02 seats), (ix) Panchkarma - 04 seats (X) Shalya Tantra -06 seats (XI) Prasuti & Stri Roga -04 seats (XII) Kayachikitsa- 04 seats and under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and **2nd renewal of permission in 01 PG courses with 04 seats in the department of Kaumarbhritya and seat increase in 03 existing PG Courses in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra - from 06 seats to 08 seats, (ii) Prasuti & Stri Roga - from 04 seats to 08 seats and (iii) Kayachikitsa- from 04 seats to 08 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.**

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Dr. G.D.Pol Foundations Yerala Medical Trust Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Institutional Area, Sector No.4, Kharghar, Navi Mumbai- 410210, Maharashtra (AYU0167)** inspection was conducted on **20.03.2025 and 21.03.2025** on **Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **permission with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 54 seats in 12 PG courses** in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-04 seats,(ii) Kriya Sharir - 04 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir-04 seats, (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats, (v) Rasa Shastra & Bhasajya Kalpana - 08 seats (vi) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan - 04 seats, (vii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka - 04 seats, (viii) Shalakya - 04 seats (opted for Shalakya Tantra Netra Roga Chikitsa-02 seats and Shalakya Tantra KNM Roga Chikitsa-02 seats), (ix) Panchkarma - 04 seats (X) Shalya Tantra -06 seats (XI) Prasuti & Stri Roga -04 seats (XII) Kayachikitsa- 04 seats and under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and **2nd renewal of permission in 01 PG courses with 04 seats in the department of Kaumarbhritya and seat increase in 03 existing PG Courses in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra - from 06 seats to 08 seats, (ii) Prasuti & Stri Roga - from 04 seats to 08 seats and (iii) Kayachikitsa- from 04 seats to 08 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26**

The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations.

- As per the Regulation no. 04 of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024 published on 01st October,2024 there shall be 18 Postgraduate programs in Ayurveda on and from the date of publication of the said Regulations shalakya Tantra Postgraduate program has been divided into Shalakya- Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) & Shalakya- Karna, Naasa and Mukha Raga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino Laryngology and same was informed to you vide letter **Ref. No.-3/2025/MARB/General Matters dated 05.05.2025 and 10.06.2025**. In response of the same you have sent an email dated **10.07.2025** in which for **04 seats of Shalakya Tantra you have opted for Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa-02 seats and Shalakya- Karna, Mukha & Nasa Roga-02 seats.**
- The assessment report was duly placed in the **134<sup>th</sup>** Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian **System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 16.07.2025** and Board Observed that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of extended permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. **Hence, the Board decided to issue extended permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) and 68 seats in 13 PG courses as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.**

**"DECISION"**

- Therefore, **Dr. G.D.Pol Foundations Yerala Medical Trust Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Institutional Area, Sector No.4, Kharghar, Navi Mumbai- 410210, Maharashtra (AYU0167)** is hereby granted with extended permission with an intake capacity of **100 seats in UG (BAMS) course** in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of

**MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and 54 seats in 12 PG courses** in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit Siddhanta-04 seats, (ii) Kriya Sharir - 04 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir-04 seats, (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 04 seats, (v) Rasa Shastra & Bhasajya Kalpana - 08 seats (vi) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan - 04 seats, (vii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka - 04 seats, (viii), (viii) Shalakyata - 04 seats (opted for Shalakyata Tantra Netra Roga Chikitsa-02 seats and Shalakyata Tantra KNM Roga Chikitsa-02 seats), (ix) Panchkarma - 04 seats (X) Shalya Tantra -06 seats (XI) Prasuti & Stri Roga -04 seats (XII) Kayachikitsa- 04 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and **2nd renewal of permission in 01 PG courses with 04 seats in the department of Kaumarbhritya and seat increase in 03 existing PG Courses in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra - from 06 seats to 08 seats, (ii) Prasuti & Stri Roga - from 04 seats to 08 seats and (iii ) Kayachikitsa- from 04 seats to 08 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 subject to the condition that following conditions shall be fulfilled:-**

- I. Minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity 68 seats in 13 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
7. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
9. **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
10. **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
  - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled,
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024,
  - iii) All the requirements of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024,
  - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
